This week...

## Onyx

In Math's we have been learning halves and quarters. We have been using this knowledge to find halves of shapes, objects and numbers. In English, we have listened to different poems and looked at words that rhyme and words that make us think of a sound.

We have enjoyed designing our flowers in module and working well with our peers in Corals class. We have learnt about different ways to join materials and chosen how we will join our flowers together. All learners are making great progress in Attention Autism, managing to focus well through all 3 states and into stage 4 with support. ## **EYFS Bike ability**

Our learners from Opals class got the opportunity to complete their Bike ability training this week on their balance bikes and what a great job they did. Four sessions throughout the day delivered by our BCP Instructors had our learners thinking about not only their own safety with regards to helmets and suitable clothing and footwear choices when riding a bike but also their A, B, C's. A - being air and the requirement to check their tyres, B - Brakes checking their brakes and C - Control checking the movement of the handlebars before setting off on a ride. They all showed great control over the bikes and spatial awareness when completing the course and being tested on their ability to stop on command. Bring on next week when Pearls class will get their opportunity to work with the BCP instructors on the Bike ability training.
